Meeting Procedures

The Board of Supervisors is the legislative body of the City and County of San Francisco. The Board has several a committees where ordinances and resolutions are the subject of hearings at which members of the public are urge. The full Board does not hold a second public hearing on measures which have been heard in committee.

Board procedures do not permit: 1) persons in the audience to vocally express support or opposition to statement Supervisors or by other persons testifying; 2) ringing and use of cell phones, pagers, and similar sound-producing devices; 3) bringing in or displaying signs in the meeting room; and 4) standing in the meeting room.

Each member of the public will be allotted the same maximum number of minutes to speak as set by the Presider at the beginning of each item or public comment, excluding City representatives, except that public speakers using interpretation assistance will be allowed to testify for twice the amount of the public testimony time limit. If simultar interpretation services are used, speakers will be governed by the public testimony time limit applied to speakers requesting interpretation assistance. Members of the public who want a document displayed should provide in adotte meeting to the Clerk of the Boatabé.legislation@sfgov.o)gclearly state such during testimony, and subsequent request the document be removed when they want the screen to return to live coverage of the meeting.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION: The public is encouraged to testify at Committee meetings. Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA)

The ADA is a civil rights law that protects people with different types of disabilities from discrimination in all aspect social life. More specifically, Title II of the ADA requires that all programs offered through the state and local gover such as the City and County of San Francisco must be accessible and usable to people with disabilities. The ADA policy require that people with disabilities have equal access to all City services, activities, and benefits. People with disabilities must have an equal opportunity to participate in the programs and services offered through the City an of San Francisco. If you believe your rights under the ADA are violated, contact the ADA Coordinator.

Ordinance 90-10 added Section 2A.22.3 to the Administrative Code, which adopted a Citywide Americans with Di Act Reasonable Modification Policy that requires City departments to: (1) provide notice to the public of the right to reasonable modification; (2) respond promptly to such requests; (3) provide appropriate auxiliary aids and service with disabilities to ensure effective communication; and (4) train staff to respond to requests from the public for reasonable modification, and that requires the Mayor's Office on Disability to provide technical assistance to City departments responding to requests from the public for reasonable modifications.

The Board of Supervisors and Office of the Clerk of the Board support the Mayor's Office on Disability to help mal Francisco a city where all people enjoy equal rights, equal opportunity, and freedom from illegal discrimination undisability rights laws.

Under Campaign and Governmental Conduct Code, Section 1.127, no person or entity with a financial interest in matter pending before the Board of Appeals, Board of Supervisors, Building Inspection Commission, Commission Community Investment and Infrastructure, Historic Preservation Commission, Planning Commission, Port Commisthe Treasure Island Development Authority Board of Directors, may make a campaign contribution to a member o Board of Supervisors, the Mayor, the City Attorney, or a candidate for any of those offices, from the date the land matter commenced until 12 months after the board or commission has made a final decision, or any appeal to an agency from that decision has been resolved.
